
Intercity Cycle Path: 1-13km return. Easy.

Begin at the Glenorchy Aquatic Centre/ Tasmanian Transport Museum car park in Anfield Street. Walk through the parking area to the railway track and make your way onto the cycle path. Follow the guide below and walk any distance in either direction. The Intercity Cycle Path continues through to the Hobart City Centre in the south and to Claremont Shopping Centre in the north. We've included local attractions, restaurants and favourite stops along the way to enhance your enjoyment of this popular amenity.

South to New Town Rivulet: 5.6 km return.

Begin on the path in a southerly direction crossing at Elwick Road. Cross Lampton Avenue (800m) and keep walking until you reach the exhibition of industrial heritage from the Derwent Park area (1.4kms). Here there is an accessible playground and picnic shelter. To continue cross at Derwent Park Road and keep walking. By the time you reach Hopkins Street you will achieve a distance of approximately 2kms.

Continue onto the intersection with Albert Road and enjoy a treat at the Valhalla Ice Cream Parlour (2.5 km). Continue to Station Street Reserve Shelter and you will have walked 2.6kms. Continue on and you will stand above New Town Rivulet, the municipal boundary between Hobart and Glenorchy. At this point your walk from the YMCA has taken you a distance of 2.8kms. You can continue on your walk into the Hobart CBD or return along the same route

North to Berriedale: 5.8km return

Begin in a northerly direction towards the Northgate Shopping Centre. The first major intersection is Grove Road (800 metres). On your way you will see on the right McKay's Timber yard; a link with the past. Continue until you reach Riverway Road (1.15kms) and here you can change your mind and turn right onto Riverway Road to connect with the Montrose Foreshore walking trails.

Otherwise continue on the cycle way to Driscoll Street Reserve (2.4kms). This is a great neighbourhood park with distant views of the river and surrounding mountains. Continue onto Berriedale Road and the International Peace Park (2.9kms). Wander through the plantings carried out by the community supporting world peace. A poem in one of the garden beds was read at the memorial gathering after the September 11th 2001 bombing in New York.

Linking into the cycle path can extend all walks. There are no limits to the walks you can devise in Glenorchy!
